#### **GRADUATE SCHOOL OF ARTS AND SCIENCES**


- Graduate study is at the heart of Yale





#### **GRADUATE STUDENT GOVERNANCE**

The Graduate School works directly with two longstanding student government organizations to identify and address of emerging needs in the student community, and to collaborate on initiatives and policies that benefit our students.

#### Graduate Student Assembly (GSA)

The Graduate Student Assembly (GSA) is an elected body of students in the Graduate School of Arts and Sciences that works with the Dean and other administrators to address the needs and concerns of graduate students. The Assembly provides a valuable means for communication among graduate students, and between graduate students and other members of the Yale community. During the pandemic crisis, the GSA was key to addressing a number of important issues affecting graduate students, including teaching fellow and trainee accommodations, resuming research, and campus safety.

#### Graduate & Professional Student Senate (GPSS)

The Yale Graduate and Professional Student Senate (Senate) is made up of representatives from each of the graduate and professional schools. The Senate's mission is to foster interaction among students through community service and engagement, social gatherings, and academic and professional events. It also supports official and unofficial student groups. The Senate represents the graduate and professional student population on official university committees, and works closely with the management of <u>Gryphon's Pub</u> to ensure its successful operation.
